Update on 9-8-8 Rollout

9-8-8 rollout began nationwide and in Georgia



Georgia has experienced an increase in the number of calls, texts and chats **Rollout Updates**



The Georgia Crisis and Access Line (GCAL) continues to maintain capacity to answer calls, texts and chats

resulted in an increase of the need for mobile crisis dispatch and active rescue

We will continue to monitor the impacts of 9-8-8 to understand need across Georgia, and partner with state government partners, providers, emergency services, advocates and community partners to support the rollout of 9-8-8.

SAMHSA Policy Academy Initiative



"Ensuring successful 988/911 coordination through the development of guidance and local implementation strategies to support statewide rollout efforts"

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) has invited Georgia and four other states to participate in a national policy academy focused on state plans for 988/911 collaboration.

- The policy academy offers an opportunity for states to develop detailed operational plans for 988/911 collaboration and receive technical assistance from national resources.
- This initiative is supported by SAMHSA's GAINS Center for Behavioral and Justice Transformation, which
 expanding access to services for people with mental and/or substance use disorders who come into contact
 with the adult criminal justice system.


The policy academy will take place from March through August 2022 and includes:

- Individual state kick-off call
- Individual state team facilitated discussion to brainstorm and gather information
- Policy academy meeting where five states will convene for facilitated breakout and joint sessions to develop a state-level plan
- Post-policy academy technical assistance to continue development of plan

We are identifying partners to participate as part of Georgia's policy academy team including:







In response to federal mandates, DBHDD developed 988 projections for Georgia and initiated foundational planning to address the impacts to the current crisis system.

DBHDD is engaging stakeholders and partners, building comprehensive plans for the crisis system, and translating plans into tactical activities to prepare for the rollout of 9-8-8.

The rollout of 9-8-8 across the state and country will take time. DBHDD will continue to partner with stakeholders and work to expand capacity to meet the demands for crisis services.

In the months and years following the 9-8-8 rollout, we will continue to work with community partners and other stakeholders to identify opportunities for the evolution of our services across the crisis continuum to meet the needs of Georgians.
